# A Message from the President

Did you ever ask - How old are the CBS Torahs? The two larger Torahs are dated about World War II time frame, that's about 75 years old. And over time letters become faded, stitching breaks, and the scroll itself deteriorates.

In order to keep using a Torah that has become worn, a Sofer or Scribe can service the Torah. Torah scrolls are precious, delicate and the center of our Jewish



identity. They therefore deserve and require expert handling and ongoing care.

Before a Torah can be restored, repaired or maintained it must first be evaluated to determine its current condition. If a scroll becomes so deteriorated it becomes non-Kosher. Most Torah restorations take place while still in a Kosher state so the cost is not overwhelming at the time of repair.

Most Torah maintenance requires cleaning, to accurately estimate what repairs may be revealed once the scroll is clean. It is entirely possible that the letters are holding well; it is equally possible that they are deteriorating and will come off during the cleaning process. These deteriorated letters can only be seen once the cleaning is complete.



Due to the caustic and damaging nature of liquid/organic solvents, a

Sofer uses a only non-invasive cleaning techniques.

When a Sofer examines a Torah, they look for:

- The overall condition of the scroll and quality of any previous repairs as well as evidence of the scroll being treated and/ or cleaned with organic solvents and the effects those may have;
- The letters: are they all black/ a mixture of browning or fading/ white spotted/ crumbling/ cracking or peeling off/ have browning letters evolved into extreme fading;
- The texture and quality of the parchment: are the edges smooth or are there tears, rips, or any holes in the parchment near letters that need patching.
- The strength of the stitching: are any loose, torn or missing

- The poles: whether they are attached properly to the scroll and roll well or if any pieces are loose;
- And any conditions in which the Torah is stored: (i.e. environment of your Ark)

A Torah which has not been cared for and has accumulated various layers of dirt which, like a white cloud, covers over letters, should first be cleaned before any restorations can proceed.

When parchment cleaning is necessary, the Sofer will ensure that all dirt, grime and other accumulated dust has been removed prior to fixing the scroll. When repairing broken and crumbling letters, they remove all the old ink before rewriting letters with new ink. It's a long process checking each letter so nothing has been over looked. The last stage of repairs is attending to the external condition of the scroll.

Letters that are thinning, light or slightly fading, browning or turning red are still considered Halachically Kosher. White spots on letters which are signs of the early stage of letter deterioration, nonetheless, they are still deemed 100% Kosher unless the "white spots" develop to a majority of the letter space, or the letter cracks into two or becomes two separate forms.

The only concern with problem letters as described above is their aesthetic beauty which is diminished as according to Halacha, they do not deem the scroll un-Kosher. Of course these letter issues can be fixed.

The status of a Torah does not change from Kosher to non-Kosher overnight. It is a slow process that





progresses over time. A lack of usage or regular maintenance allows the deterioration to spiral until the damage is viewed and becomes prohibitively expensive to repair. As such, it is simple to understand that even after a scroll has been restored, there may still be letters that have begun the deterioration process yet have not exhibited signs of it.

For this reason regular rolling and viewing the scroll will expose these unfolding problems and then they can be fixed in a timely fashion.

They make great gifts for your friends, family and neighbors and when you have used one or two coupons from the booklet it will pay for itself!



## Remembering Sylvia Tarshis

*The following was written by Michele Schulman, a year ago when we lost Sylvia Tarshis. Michele has absolutely crafted some beautiful words, which were read at the unveiling at the gravesite.*

### Thank you Sylvia

It is often a tragic fact that we never really realize how much we have learned from the people around us until they are gone. I have so many memories of Sylvia, and it wasn't until very recently that I understood how much she taught me.

When I was seven or eight, I got to hold the Torah at her second Bat Mitzvah. I remember she had bronchitis and

could barely speak above a whisper, but I watched on in awe as she got up on the bimah and read Torah anyways. Nothing was going to interfere with her special day and her dedication inspired me to want to achieve the same milestone one day.

I believe it was over a bagel brunch when I was about 12, that she told me the story of why

she decided to get to Hebrew school over Girl Scouts. The real reason being, and I quote, "because that's where the boys were!"

I will always remember Sylvia as someone who always actively participated in Jewish learning and discussions. I find it sadly fitting that I learned that Sylvia had passed



away as I was studying a line in Pirke Avot, Ethics of the Fathers. I was having a meaningful Jewish conversation with a dozen student leaders regarding a passage about finding a community, and then building it up so it can grow. My students and I spent an hour discussing how to reach out to our university's Jewish community and through the entire time, all I could think about was how Sylvia had done the exact same thing 47 years before.

She made a community come together out of nothing, and she was just continuing a tradition that Jews have carried on for over 5775 years.

Now the tiny synagogue she had that started 47 years ago, has affected hundreds of lives and families – especially my own. There is no way she could have possibly known how much Congregation Beth Shalom, *nee*. Temple Beth Sholom, would grow – let alone how strong an impact it would have on the families it serves. All she had was the desire to make a small difference at that time. So thank you Sylvia. Thank you for creating a community that I can call home.

May her memory be a blessing to us all.





**SPECIAL ALERT: 91 Project in Corona to Require Weekend Full Closure of Eastbound and Westbound 91 between State Route 71 and Interstate 15 9 pm, Friday, February 19 to 4 am, Monday, February 22, 2016**

As part of the Riverside County Transportation Commission's (RCTC) 91 Project, there will be a 55-hour weekend **full closure of the 91 in both directions** between the 71 and I-15 in Corona from 9 pm, Friday, February 19 to 4 am, Monday, February 22, 2016.

This closure, branded "91 Steer Clear," is needed to perform three major construction activities:

1. Demolish the west side of the Maple Street Bridge over the 91
2. Install support beams for the new westbound Maple Street flyover ramp bridge

Pave the new eastbound 91 alignment near I-15  
By fully closing the roadway, these significant construction efforts can be consolidated into one weekend, rather than multiple weekends or extending this over a month of weeknight closures. The full closure also will help ensure the safety of construction crews and the traveling public by eliminating cars and construction equipment on the road at the same time.

To minimize travel delays and impacts during the closure, RCTC strongly recommends that motorists plan ahead and completely avoid travel on and near the 91 in Corona or stay home. If travel cannot be avoided, motorists can use the 57, 60 and I-10 as alternate routes. Motorists traveling on the 91, 71 or I-15 near the project area during the closure period can expect delays of three to four hours. Please see detour map to the side.

In case of rainstorms or inclement weather, the Feb. 19-22 closure will be postponed to the next weekend, weather permitting.

Once the weekend construction activities are completed, more work is on the way for the Maple Street area during the coming months. Crews will rebuild the Maple Street bridge and construct the flyover ramp bridge across the 91. Nightly full closures of eastbound 91 likely


will be required for about a week following the full weekend closure. Once the flyover ramp bridge at Maple Street is completed this summer, another full closure of the 91 will be needed to remove the temporary support beams that will be placed the weekend of Feb. 19-22.
