

A Message from the President

I was sent a text the other day to check out a cute video clip. This involved a group of senior Jewish people coming together for Shabbat. This is not uncommon all over the world to have dinner together and enjoy lighting the Shabbat candles and the prayers. Of course they have Challah and wine (or maybe grape juice - don't quite know), but the camaraderie and socializing is what Shabbat is for many people.

I can recall when we first joined CBS, Bobby and Karen Spiegel would always do Shabbat dinner at the Sizzler and invite everyone. Why Sizzler? In the backroom we could arrange the tables to accommodate as many people that showed up. Plus all the kids would be there too. We easily had 20-25 people enjoying dinner together and on some occasions we actually brought candles too.

The kids were babies and there would be more food on the floor than on the table some nights. Twenty-five years later, we make it the 1st Friday after Shabbat service to find a place to have dinner. It's customary these days to find new places, yet some still enjoy the Sizzler.

Everyone likes to attend dinner after Shabbat – to catch up on the news, trade stories, talk about our next fundraiser event, anything. And food is not the problem, it's usually overstaying past closing hours. We've seen the restaurant staff clean

around us we keep talking and getting endless drink refills.

Our CBS Sisterhood plans many dine-out events, again to mingle during dinner and the restaurants give back 15-25% from all our dinner checks. It's a great and easy fundraiser.

At our High Holy Days, we do a community luncheon at Rosh Hashanah lunch break after the morning service and a Pre-Kol-Nidre Dinner. These are held at the Sizzler for the same reason – the big backroom.

In December, a couple of couples decided on the typical dinner on Christmas Day, the word got out and we had over 40 people at the restaurant.

So to have many Jewish singles and couples enjoy Shabbat dinner – we're all coming together as community and sharing these traditions together.

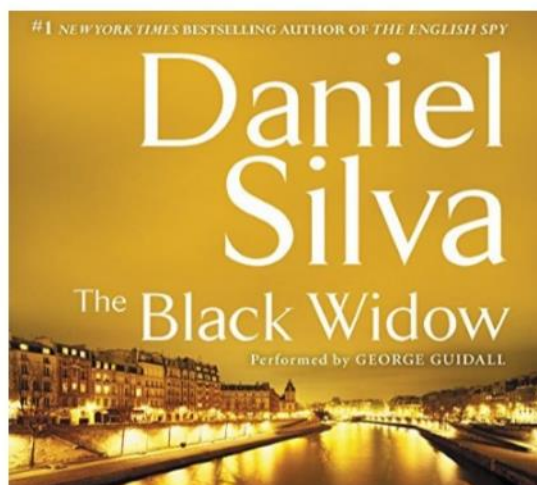
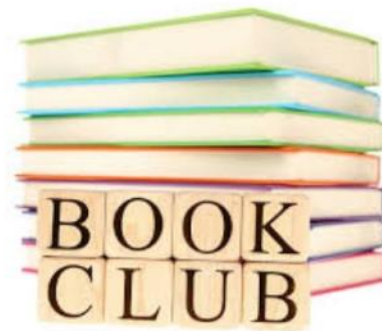
