Stumble Stones has synagogue connection! A Message from the President

tolpersteine or otherwise called stumble stones. They are meant to trip memory. Each is a brass plaque measuring about 4 by 4 inches and hand-engraved by artist Gunter Demnig with the name and a few terse details of someone lost to the Holocaust. Each stumble stone is set permanently into the sidewalk outside the place where the individual lived, laughed, and loved -- usually a house or apartment building and sometimes a shop or office.



Mr. Demnig has hammered more than 10,000 plaques into the sidewalks of 202 German cities and towns. Each stone represents archival research by families or Jewish groups as well as the painstaking work of carving of the malleable yellow metal.

The project has been described as the largest artwork in Europe. It is a work in progress, certainly, and a work seemingly without end. A few stumble stones have been wrenched from the ground by irate neighbors or neo-Nazis. Others have been defaced with swastikas. There are still a few places in Germany where ultra-right sentiment burns fiercely enough among locals that Demnig can go about his labor only with a police escort.

"Those are police rules, not my rules," stressed Demnig, a soft-spoken man who almost invariably wears a faded work shirt, red bandanna, and battered slouch hat. He survives on small private donations, refusing public money. "I don't feel in danger."

The low-key memorials have become a familiar part of the urban landscape in Germany, glinting on swank shopping boulevards or on gritty back streets of industrial neighborhoods. The personal-sized monuments seem to pack more emotional wallop than tar grander memorials to the Holocaust.

Demning said, This stone has a name of a single person on a single marker is to say, 'Look, this individual lived -- lived right here at this actual address. He or she looked out this window or stepped out that door every day. This

was someone just like you or me. Not just an anonymous victim of history.'

One of the stones has the name Berta Spiegel, whose maiden name was Scheuer, and her husband, Josef Spiegel, ran a sporting goods shop at 6 Buccheimer St. in the Cologne suburb of Muelheim. The couple was "deported," the Nazi euphemism for removal of Jews from Germany, to Theresienstadt concentration camp, located in the present-day Czech Republic. They died there. Berta on Feb. 16, 1942 and Josef on Aug. 7, 1942.

"They were my grandparents on my father's side. They were just ordinary decent people leading quiet lives," said Herbert Spiegel, who with his parents escaped Germany at age 13, finding refuge in the United States. The retired electrical contractor spoke by phone from his home in Corona, Calif. "Then they were taken away and killed. Who knows why such things happen?"

Herbert Spiegel lost nearly a dozen relatives to the Nazis, including an uncle, Paul Spiegel, killed at an unknown date in the 1940s at Auschwitz, a German death camp located in Poland. It was at the behest of the Californian that Demnig installed three stumble stones in remembrance of Berta, Josef and Paul Spiegel outside the former premises of the sporting goods shop in Muelheim, now part of Cologne. "This makes this a place of remembrance for these three people," Demnig said. "It is not for 'all Jews' or 'all victims.' It is three markers for three human beings. If someone comes to mourn at this site, it should be for these three lost lives."

Only one mourner for the Spiegels attended the laying ceremony on a gray, rain-swept day: Jeanette Schoett, a

Jeanette Schoett, a great-granddaughter of Berta and Josef. Her own mother escaped the Nazis, but eventually returned to Cologne.

"I'm grateful that this work has been done," she said. "It's frightening that even today there are some [Germans] who still paint their swastikas and do vandalism against Jews."






Religious School Update





When Fiction Becomes Non-Fiction: A Case of Literary Mystification "Holocaust Fraud"

Dr. Barry Resnick presentation covers a seven-year investigation into a best-selling book that was sold as a true story based on events during WWII and how it turned out to be fictionalized. A clever author who slightly changed historical events; a group of felons; a duped protagonist and the world's largest publishing company contributed to the creation of the story and eventual book written in 13 languages and sold in 27 countries. Eventually movie rights were sold and a major media blitz in the U.S. was ready to launch...until the story began to unravel.

Dr Resnick, a resident of Anaheim Hills, is a counseling department faculty member with the Rancho Santiago Community College District. He has just completed his 38th year with the RSCCD. Dr. Resnick, a graduate of USC, earned his doctorate at BYU.



Demnig has also installed stones outside the former dwellings of other Holocaust victims -- gypsies and Jehovah's Witnesses, homosexuals and left-wing activists. Not all Germans or even all Jews admire his work.

Some cities such as Munich has flatly refused to grant the artist permission to install stumble stones.

Families seeking memorials pay a fee of 95 Euros (about \$122) to help cover the cost of materials. The waiting list stretches for years, and increasingly Demnig is fielding requests from other descendants of Jews deported from other parts of Europe to the Nazi death camps.

He has installed stumble stones in Austria and expects to install the first in Hungary this year.

He is awaiting approval from the Netherlands, Italy, Denmark, Ukraine and expects permits will be granted. Demnig says that so far France has not approved the project.

He usually puts in 12-hour days and seven-day weeks installing the stones with crowbars, chisels, and hammer. It's exhausting work.

"Officials lay wreaths, but average citizens rarely bother with these places," he said. "Stumble stones are on streets where everyone walks. The names cry out from the sidewalks of everyday life." Demnig has won recognition for his project.

In 2005, he received the Obermayer German—Jewish History Award, established by Massachusetts entrepreneur Arther Obermayer.

"This is my life's work. I will continue for as long as I'm able," Demnig said.


