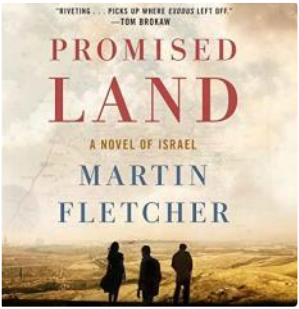

Annually our little synagogue hosts a very large event that highlights the good deeds of our members as well as community members. March 10, 2019 will mark the 13th consecutive year where CBS and the community come together to acknowledge and honor some great individuals. We are featuring our three honorees in monthly newsletter articles to give you a better perspective on who is receiving which award and why.

Last month we featured Angela Rosser who will be honored with the Shomer Tzedek (Guardian of Righteousness) Award and this month's newsletter article will feature Shirli Driz who will receive CBS' Legacy Award for her tremendous dedication and involvement in our synagogue and the Jewish community.

Shirli was born in Ashkelon, Israel in a traditionally conservative Jewish home immigrating to the United States at the age of seven with her parents, an older sister and a younger brother. Shirli was exposed to a strong work ethic early in life. At the young age of eight, she would be awakened, hesitantly, in the early morning hours to join her parents at work in local swap meets. This was where her passion for sales and leadership began. During her teen years, while all of her friends were getting jobs in the fast food industry, Shirli knew that she wanted to pursue a different career path. She received a certificate in banking from a local ROP program, started an internship with Wells Fargo and was hired by them shortly after. While working, Shirli earned her Bachelor of Arts in International Business with a concentration in Spanish from California State University, Fullerton. Over 28 years later, Shirli is now a Consumer Banking District Manager with Wells Fargo and is responsible for 11 branches, which includes over 230 employees and over 900 million dollars in deposits.

Shirli has always been very proud of her Jewish faith and heritage and believed in living a life filled with mitzvot. She has a strong sense of tzedakah and has shown this by her passion of giving back to the community. Shirli currently serves as the Chair and Finance Committee member for the Inland Empire United Way, an advisor for their Desert Communities chapter, treasurer and finance



committee member for the Academy for Grassroots Organization and recently ended several terms as treasurer of CBS's Board of Directors. Shirli's "giving back" extends beyond the board room, however. Her passion for the kitchen/catering started with being by her mom's side preparing Shabbat, High Holiday and simple dinners with recipes passed down from her Bubbe. Shirli volunteers with preparing CBS's Hanukkah bazaar luncheon, Break-the-Fast, and whenever kitchen help is needed. She is the Scrip Fundraiser Coordinator for CBS where funds are used for the synagogue's youth and educational programs and has additionally taught CBS' confirmation class in the past and is a substitute teacher in CBS's religious school.

Shirli resides in Eastvale with her mother and daughter where she has lived since 2004. She was honored with being selected as the treasurer of the Incorporation Committee and helped to incorporate the city in 2010. Shirli has been back to Israel several times over the years but is most excited about the celebration of her daughter's Bat Mitzvah in Israel next June with CBS's congregational trip. Shirli exemplifies the Legacy Award by "giving back" and helping others in need, both personally and professionally.

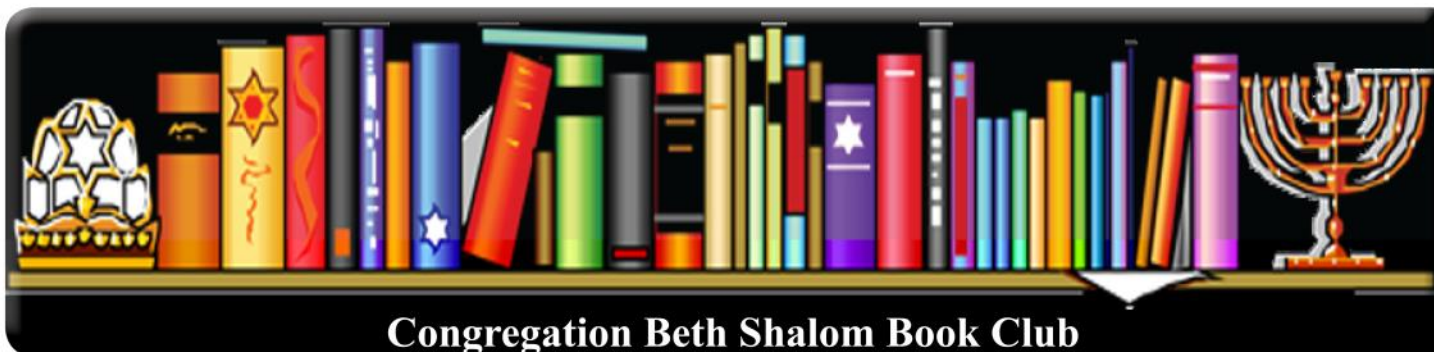

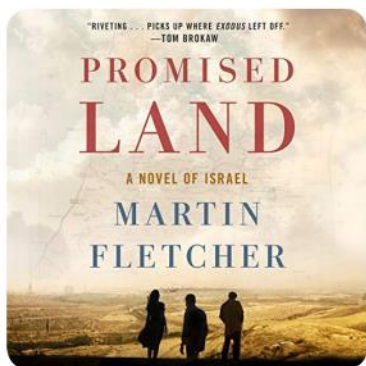

The collection of pull tabs will continue, and we hope all members of the synagogue participate.

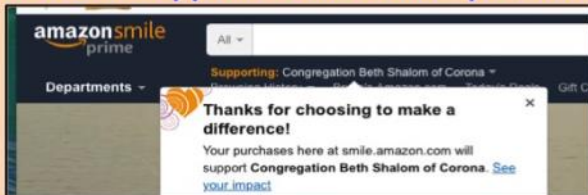
