

are there for a reason. In our homes it allows our children and even ourselves to feel like we have order and calm. The things that are most important that we take for granted are food, shelter, clothing, and a safe place to stay. Life is more complicated than what is written here, but the gist of the story is that laws provide us with a way



of life and an order in which to do it. The Torah is our "instruction book". The word **Tur (תור)** means to seek out or explore. Our parents are the ones who teach us how to explore and are the guides who teach us how to seek out life. Our parents are or were like our own "personal torah"!

As Jews, we continue to look for ways to create order and discipline not only for ourselves, but for others as well. A few chapters back, we discussed **Nachshon**, the one who first entered into the Sea of Reeds right before the waters split so that the Israelites could safely pass during the Exodus from Egypt. "Every great moment in history, every person who achieves greatness, every person who conquers their fears that may have paralyzed him or her has that Nachshon moment".

Our parents and our teachers provide "law and order" for us so that we are able to stand up when necessary, strive forward to the next goal, and achieve our lifelong dreams.

Adon Olam, Master of the Universe, thank you for our parents and grandparents who came before us who gave us the Torah to live so that we can attempt to live and achieve the life we so deserve. May the memories of our loved ones serve as a light and a blessing to us any time we are in need and remember that we have the lessons of life with us, around and within us at all times.

President Message

his month I want to give everyone, status on our security and safety measures we have taken since last year. Joan Jacobs has been our point of contact to connect with many people around the country on "Webinars". These webinars are currently addressing synagogue security. One of the first



actions was to have CBS, visited by an FBI representative. The meeting at CBS was to walk around the facility and make some recommendations for safety and security. This included locking at doors, windows, exit paths, lighting, obstacles, signage and any hazards in

the facility, etc. Since this meeting, Joan has brought this message to the board and studies from across the US on what many synagogues are doing in response to the Pittsburgh Synagogue incident.

At CBS, we have already taken some measures to improve our security and safety. We have changed out the rear sanctuary door exit hardware to a single push panic exit bar. Also there is no handle on the outside of that door nor lock to break into.

As for the warehouse unit, we changed that to a single handle exit where the dead bolt is automatically opened too. This again is much easier to operate in case of emergencies.

For the front doors, I asked that either the A1 or the A2 front door be opened at a time, not both. We are also checking into a locking feature so that the doors can be closed and remotely opened and possible cameras positioned to see visitors. This is all being considered.

We are planning on emergency evacuation drills for the students so everyone knows how to exit the building and where to go for an emergency. Also, we have a central alarm system installed for fire detection, smoke alarm, motion detectors, door alarms, etc. This is when the building is locked, a central call center contacts one of 5 people on our emergency list. We recently installed 2 new independent fire and CO2 alarms in both A1 and A2 areas. We recently had our fire extinguishers serviced in both A1 & A2. Also, the Corona Fire Department is doing an on-site inspection this month. With that being said, we are planning on the representative from the Corona Fire Department to give us a briefing on safety and security in March. We will announce this for everyone to be at CBS for this informational meeting.

Other measures to be implemented are people to view the front door to watch visitors. And we are requesting additional lighting on the side of the building and improved front lighting.



Not Me: A Novel Michael Lavigne



of Me is a remarkable debut novel that tells the dramatic and surprising stories of two men–father and son–through sixty years of uncertain memory, distorted history, and assumed identity.

When Heshel Rosenheim, apparently suffering from Alzheimer's disease, hands his son, Michael, a box of moldy old journals, an amazing adventure begins—one that takes the reader from the concentration camps of Poland to an improbable love story during the battle for Palestine, from a cancer ward in New Jersey to a hopeless marriage in San Francisco. The journals, which seem to tell the story of Heshel's life, are so harrowing, so riveting, so passionate, and so perplexing that Michael becomes obsessed with discovering the truth about his father.

As Michael struggles to come to grips with his father's elusive past, a world of complex and disturbing possibilities opens up to him—a world in which an accomplice to genocide may have turned into a virtuous Jew and a young man cannot recall murdering the person he loves most; a world in which truth is fiction and fiction is truth and one man's terrible—or triumphant—transformation calls history itself into question. Michael must then solve the biggest riddle of all: Who am I?

We love having our Pre- and Post-B'nai Mitzvah students lead services, and don't want to leave the rest of you feeling there is no time that you can experience what they do.


