Last month was Israel's 71st birthday. Hard to believe that time is flying by so quickly for this "start-up" nation and for people in general. It was just a little over 2 years ago that our trip to Israel was "a dream" and this month it is a reality. 29 people from CBS and surrounding areas, our multi-faith group will fly to Israel for a 10-day adventure on the ground.

Having been to Israel for now my 4th time (Marcy 5 times), I would expect our group to change, grow, learn, and see firsthand how Israeli's live their lives in the environment that they are surrounded by. Oh, yes, and eat lots of good food!

In **B'ha'a lot'Kha** (Numbers 8:5-12:10), G-d places an emphasis on the Menorah (which we will see when we visit the Western Wall and is in a giant showcase to potentially be used in the building of the 3rd Temple), the seven-branched lampstand, and secondly, the duties of the Levites. Why are these 2 items identified as important?

"For more than 1000 years, the Menorah was the symbol of Aarons descendants, the Hasmoneans (a Hanukiyah, an 8 branched menorah is used for Hanukah). Roman soldiers used a Menorah in victory parades over the Jews, and the Menorah became the State Seal of Israel. The light of the Menorah would never be put out similar to that of the burning bush."

"According to Isaac Luria, the Ari, he taught that the

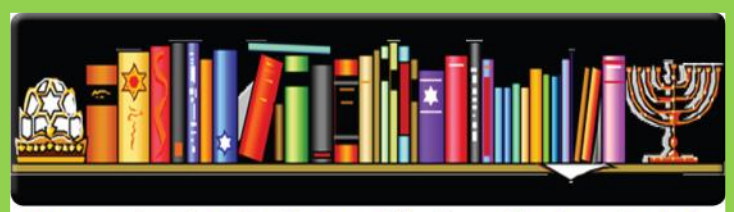

President Message

This month I want to talk about Security. It's on everyone's mind, and on TV and in the news much too often. That said, what is Congregation Beth Shalom doing to enhance our security position.



Back in November 2018, I enlisted Joan Jacobs, Sam Miller and Joel Friedberg to check out what our possible upgrades should be.

They immediately contacted the Corona Police and FBI special security resources group to "walk the premises". They made several suggestions, some we can immediately implement, others we need to decide.



Many ideas have been developed and talked about on the USCJ webinars. These webinars are basically "Town Hall" meetings which Joan Jacobs attends via calling into a nation-wide phone number each month.

Basically, our goal is not to create high barriers, keeping the synagogue out of reach and box us in, but rather use sound judgement and create awareness of our surroundings. Joan has already had our Religious school students do a practice emergency drill, similar to that in public schools. The kids knew exactly what to do once they were informed to leave the building. Our parents and adults are next to do this. Consider this a muster drill on a cruise ship, it's for our own good.

First, we installed a panic push bar on the rear exit door in the sanctuary, Exit signs above the exit doors and a single turn handle in the warehouse exit door. We have requested that the A2 door be locked and only the A1 door be used to enter & exit CBS. Also, it is important to lock the front lobby door in suite A1, 15 minutes after services begin. Should you need to come in the building, just ring the doorbell. A very simplistic solution, and someone will open the door. We intend to add a video camera and monitor and also add remote door unlocking feature.

It Takes a Community: What You Can Do to Help: Synagogue safety is a community responsibility. Here are tips for how you can help ensure synagogue safety as well as safety at other oft-targets for violence like schools and concerts:

- If you see something, like a knapsack lying against a wall unattended, say something.

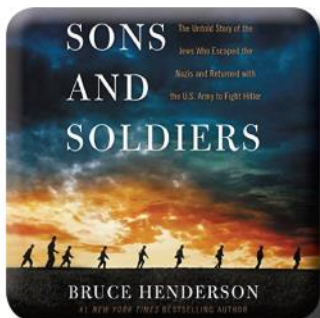

Yale researchers find - People who read live longer than those who don't.



They were young Jewish boys who escaped from Nazi-occupied Europe and resettled in America. After the United States entered the war, they returned to fight for their adopted homeland and for the families they had left behind. Their stories tell the tale of one of the U.S. Army's greatest secret weapons.

Sons and Soldiers begins during the menacing rise of Hitler's Nazi party, as Jewish families were trying desperately to get out of Europe. Bestselling author Bruce Henderson captures the heartbreaking stories of parents choosing to send their young sons away to uncertain futures in America, perhaps never to see them again. As these boys became young men, they were determined to join the fight in Europe. Henderson describes how they were recruited into the U.S. Army and how their unique knowledge of

the German language and psychology was put to use to interrogate German soldiers.

Sons and Soldiers draws on original interviews and extensive archival research to vividly re-create the individual stories of six of these men, tracing their journeys from childhood through their escapes from Europe, their feats and sacrifices during the war, finally their desperate attempts to find their missing loved ones. Sons and Soldiers is an epic story of heroism, courage and patriotism that will not soon be forgotten.

- Get familiar with emergency exits and plans.
- Don't leave doors open to the outside—something as simple as propping open a door to get air as you are helping prepare *Kiddush* in your synagogue kitchen can result in a security breach.
- Introduce yourself if you don't recognize someone at your synagogue or see someone wandering around; create a culture of nicely asking what they are looking for and if you can help.
- Support your synagogue leadership as they implement safety measures instead of seeing changes as a hassle.
- Always air on the side of caution.

Also join us at the **Annual Membership Meeting on Sunday June 2nd at 12noon**, for a free breakfast/brunch. Besides presenting the "State of the Shul" havi and having our elections for our new board members, we'll show our "2019 Annual Yer in Review" video. 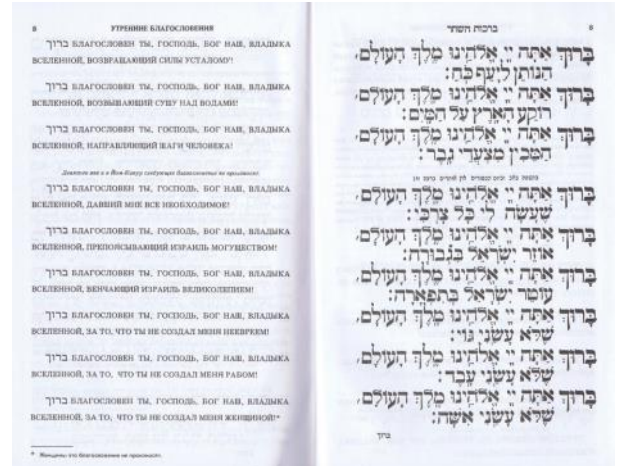

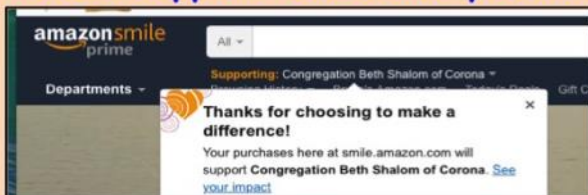

Joan Zak Spoke at a Women's Christian Bible Study

Below is a short story on her experience....

On April 8th I was privileged to give a presentation to a Bible study group at the Canyon Church of the Nazarene here in Corona. A group of about twenty women gave me a warm welcome. I passed out Mark Koren's hamentaschen before I started and received many complements on the delicious pastries.

They had been studying the Book of Esther for 7 weeks, so I assumed they knew the story and focused my attention on the position of Esther in the TaNaCh, and some of the different commentaries regarding it. As you know, Esther is one of only two books in the Bible that don't contain the name of God. The other is Song of Songs. Despite this, many commentators, especially Christian ones, focus on God acting "behind the scenes" to direct the events in the story. In fact, one woman was quite disturbed when I suggested that the story might not be true. "If it's not", she protested, "then God didn't really perform a miracle and the story doesn't mean as much."

I was introduced to a very different means of Torah study than we do on Shabbat mornings. The study was about Chapter 9 of the Book of Esther, but the presenter, a lovely young Southern woman, focused on about 3 words from the chapter and made it a study of how women were warriors and needed to fight for their families! She focused on the reversal of fortune that allowed the Jews to prevail over the Persians who wanted to kill them. The funny thing is that I really struggle with the story of Jews killing innocents, but they didn't have a problem with it at all. Besides the few words of Esther, she mentioned Psalms, Deuteronomy and Nehemiah (also in the writings). I see why we believe words can be taken out of context when a presentation seems that scattered. Also, I believe that my assumption that they knew the story of Purim was probably mistaken.

I had the women make groggers out of cardboard tubes, such as toilet paper rolls. They really enjoyed that activity and created some beautiful noisemakers. I brought black and garbanzo beans and lentils to fill them and the noise they made was quite satisfying.

All in all, it was a lovely opportunity to get to know our Christian neighbors and find elements we have in common. I look forward to our involvement in more of these activities.

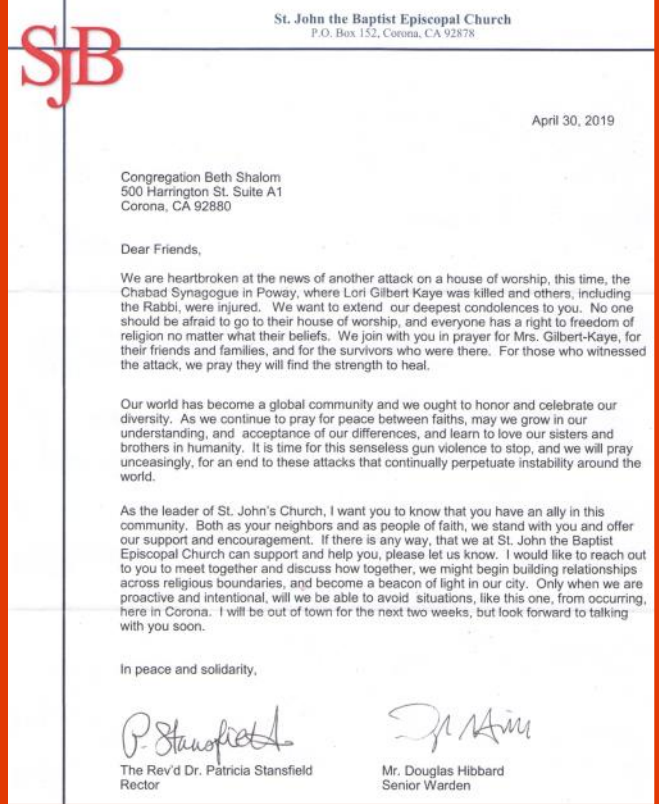

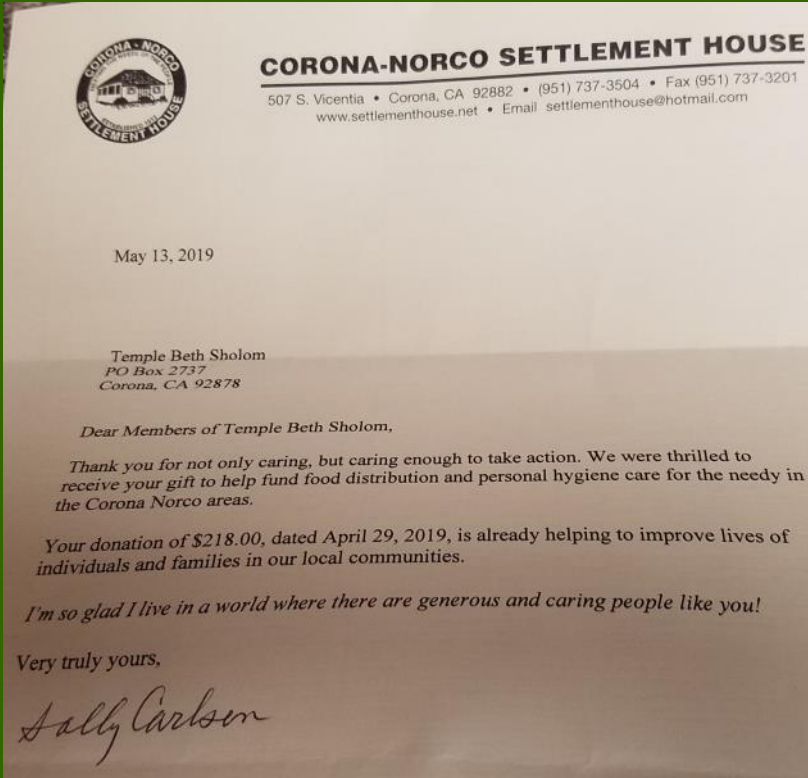
