This has been a beautiful summer so far. The trip to Israel was successful, Marcy and I became foster parents to two amazing children ages 6 and now four months, and we are expecting our first grandchild this month! How could it get much better?

I am reminded that with all good things, we must remain humble and grounded. Many of us have great successes and failures throughout our lives. As we head into the High Holiday season, we

are reminded in the month of Av during August, of the destruction of not only the 1st and 2nd Temples, but other times of destruction for the Jewish people as well, including the 12 Spies, the Crusades, and the Holocaust. **Tisha (9th) B'Av** (of the month of Av), begins on Saturday, August 10, in the evening, and ends on Sunday night. It is a full day fast like Yom Kippur. Even Havdalah is delayed until Sunday night. On this day, we recite **Kinnot** (dirges or sad poems which begin with "tales of woe" and end with optimism for the future) and the **Megillah of Eichah** (Lamentations). I encourage you to

Thank you again for your continual support.

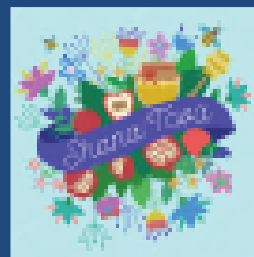

Tisha B'Av is followed by **Tu (15th) B'Av**, a day of communal celebration, and some would say it is the equivalent of Valentine's Day and is celebrated as a day of love. It was normally the beginning of the grape harvest. "The Talmud explains that the daughters of Israel used to dress in white and go out to the vineyards and dance. Young unmarried men would follow after them in the hope of finding a bride!"

Lastly, during the month of Av, we say goodbye to the numerical book (B'Midbar-literally in the wilderness/desert/Numbers) of the counting of the people, blessing and curses, and the passing of leadership from Moses, to Aaron, to Joshua as the dream began in (Vayikra-Leviticus) and became a reality in Numbers. We begin the final book of the Bible, **Deuteronomy** as we head towards the High Holidays! This is Moses' final discourse as the children of Israel after 40 years in the Desert are finally going to make it to the "Promised Land". Imagine waiting 40 years for your dreams to come true. Imagine the exhilaration, the excitement, yet the sadness of a generation who left Egypt and would not have the chance to make it there. With happiness, comes being grounded, humility, and growth! President's Message

During our tour of Israel, our tour guide, Sara Goldsmith, spoke of many unique facts of the land, people, their industries, etc. With that I looked up some facts of Israel that you may not know. Here are some...



Israel is the only country in the world that entered the 21st century with a net gain in its number of trees. Since the JNF starts about 120 years ago, they planted 270 million trees, plus the 30 we planted on our trip. The JNF-KKL owns 13% of the land in Israel.



Israel has the third highest rate of entrepreneurship among women and people over 55 in the entire world.

Israel is only 1/6 of 1% of the landmass of the Middle East.

Israel Invented this....it's an Anti-Date rape straw was invented in Israel. It's designed to detect date rape drugs when placed in a beverage and alerts the victim.

With more than 3,000 high-tech companies and start-ups, Israel has the highest concentration of hi-tech companies in the world (apart from the Silicon Valley)



Did you know the flash drive is an Israel invention. When Golda Meir became prime minister of Israel in 1969, she was only the third woman elected to lead a country in the modern world.

The Sea of Galilee — located .212 km below sea level — is the lowest freshwater lake in the world (and the largest in Israel).

The Dead Sea being 1410 feet below sea level is the lowest place on Earth.

Israel is one of only three democracies in the world without a codified constitution.

The glue on Israeli stamps is kosher.

Israel is the only country to revive an unspoken language and establish it as its national tongue!

Jerusalem's Mount of Olives is the world's oldest continuously used cemetery.

Occupied East Jerusalem? Jewish neighborhoods built in the late 1970s and early 1980s such as Gilo, Ramot, French Hill, and Pisgat Ze'ev, as well as the newer Har Homa area, completed in 2005. Today, there are about 200,000 Jews and 270,000 Arabs living in Jerusalem territory that had been annexed by Jordan until 1967.

El Al, Israel's national airline, set the world record for the most passengers on a commercial flight.



The world's largest pepper was grown in Israel's Moshav Ein Yahav, as recorded by The Guinness Book of World Records in 2013.

Life expectancy at birth in Israel is at 82 years (two years more than the OECD average).

Israel's national bird is the hoopoe!

Heart tissue regeneration is possible in the U.S. thanks to Israeli stem-cell technology.

An Israeli company has developed the world's first jellyfish repellent.

Israel is one of only nine countries in the world that can launch its own satellites into space.

Israeli scientists have discovered the cause of chronic bad breath and an easy way to fix it!

More than 44% of all lawyers registered in Israel are women!

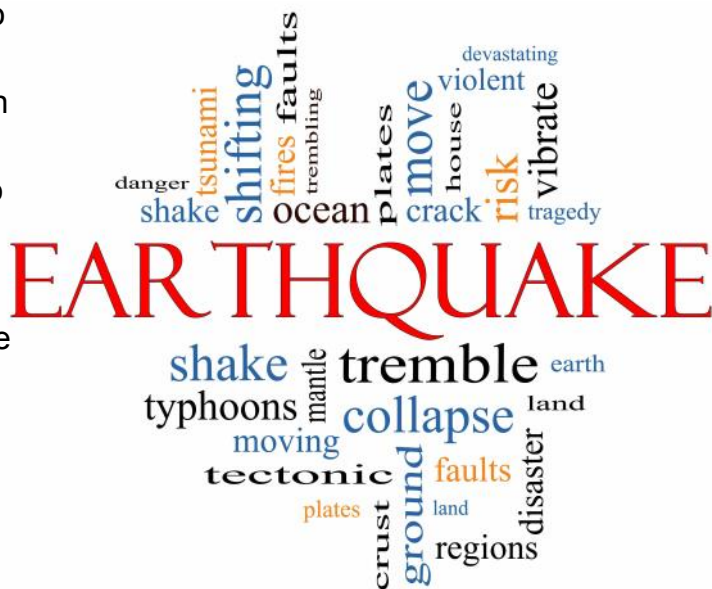
When you come to services, you will hear information about what to do in case of an earthquake at CBS, in addition to information about fire and active shooter safety.

Relative to its population, Israel is the largest immigrant-absorbing nation on earth. Immigrants come in search of democracy, religious freedom, and economic opportunity.

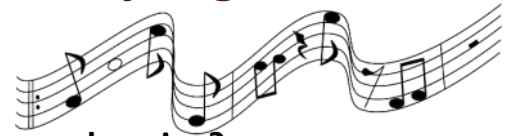

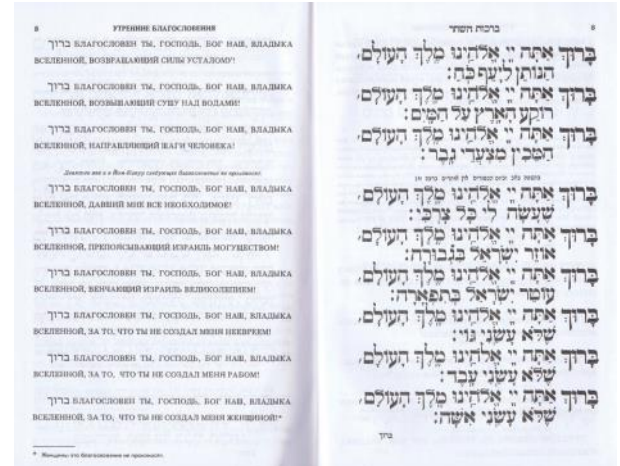

So, how about it? Give us a chance to prove how fulfilling an Erev Shabbat service can be.

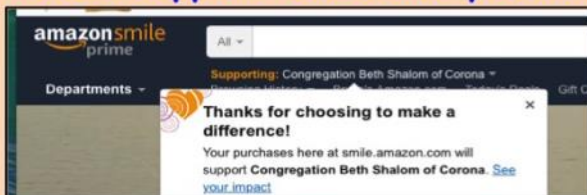

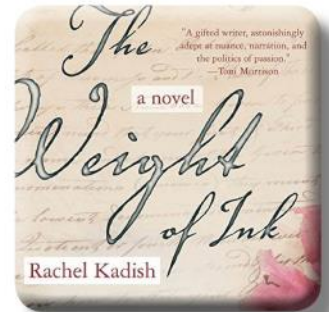
Congregation Beth Shalom Book Club

Yale researchers find - People who read live longer than those who don't.

Set in the London of the 1660s and of the early 21st century, *The Weight of Ink* is the interwoven tale of two women of remarkable intellect: Ester Velasquez, an emigrant from Amsterdam who is permitted to scribe for a blind rabbi just before the plague hits the city, and Helen Watt, an ailing historian with a love of Jewish history.

As the novel opens, Helen has been summoned by a former student to view a cache of 17th-century Jewish documents newly discovered in his home during a renovation. Enlisting the help of Aaron Levy, an American graduate student as impatient as he is charming, and in a race with another fast-moving team of historians, Helen embarks on one last project: to determine the identity of the documents' scribe, the elusive "Aleph".

Electrifying and ambitious, sweeping in scope and intimate in tone, *The Weight of Ink* is a sophisticated work of historical fiction about women separated by centuries, and the choices and sacrifices they must make in order reconcile the life of the heart and mind.

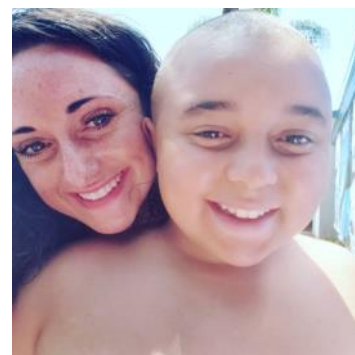

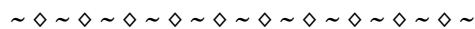

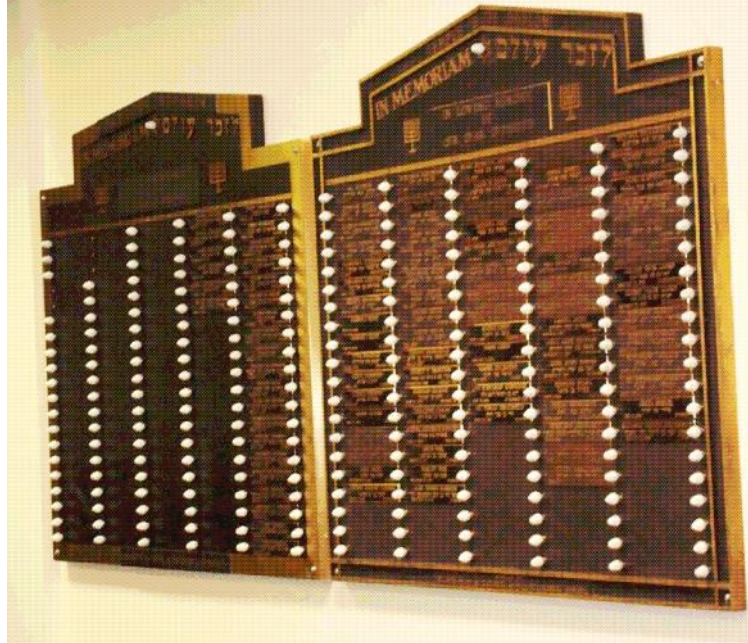
