IT'S HARD TO BE SAD WHEN THE WEATHER IS SO BEAUTIFUL!

WHY DO I HAVE TO REPEAT MYSELF?

One of the Torah portions in the month of July is **Devarim** and is **Shabbat Hazon**. The 1st word of the Haftarah (Isaiah 1:1-27) is **Hazon**. This word means prophecies. That Shabbat immediately precedes **Tisha B'Av** (9th day of Av) a sad day in Jewish history and also a "Fast Day". The beginning of the final chapter of the 5 Books is the retelling of the Exodus from Egypt as well as the direction the Israelites should take into the land of Canaan. The Haftarah reminds me of the 1st Rocky movie made in 1976 or perhaps the fight between Mohammed Ali and George Foreman also known as the "Rumble in the Jungle" (in Zaire)!

The Israelites rebelled and were disciplined by Hashem. It was a psychological and physical beating in the desert. But the people kept coming back for more, paying attention, learning, and growing stronger. Finally, a good word, and positive news. At the end, "Zion shall be saved in the judgment;" (and be redeemed with justice) (Isaiah 1:27). We must remember to stress **human justice**, a battle or conflict which continues on today throughout the world.

It can sometimes be difficult to maintain faith when life is being rough on you. **Abravenal**, who lived at the time of the Inquisition and the Expulsion from Spain, said the following about forced conversion: "Many Jews will be brought to forced conversion, worshiping idols but knowing full well that they are made of wood and stone. Unable to practice the observance of Judaism, their seeking of G-d will be in their hearts and minds alone." As we say in the Shema, "with all your heart, and all your soul, and with all your might." Aren't we fortunate we do not have to be forced from our faith but can practice it openly? Yes, we are facing a rise in Anti-Semitism, but we can still be an observant Jew in our homes and with our community.

Shabbat Nahamu, the Shabbat after Tisha B'av (**Va'etchanan**) is the first of the 7 Shabbatot of consolation leading up to Rosh Hashanah. The first word of this haftarah is Nahamu which means "console yourselves". During this Shabbat we read the words, (Deut. 5:1) ... "Hear, O Israel, the laws and rules that I proclaim to you this day! Study them and observe them faithfully!" We have an obligation as parents and grandparents to teach our children and grandchildren.

Adon Olam, Master of the Universe, may we turn inward during the month of Tammuz-Av and look for ways to improve our lives and the lives of others around us. It is through Your blessings and for You that we perform Gemilut Hasadim (Good Deeds). During our summer holiday provide us with the time we need to rest, repair, and grow as individuals and as a community.

I am looking forward to seeing you all in person or on Zoom in August when I return from my trip to Alaska! As the Pandemic winds down, may we continue to **stay healthy and please continue to wear a mask as required. Enjoy your summer!**

The brotherhood will have a welcome back to school breakfast for the students, families and all our members that morning, so stay tuned for details.

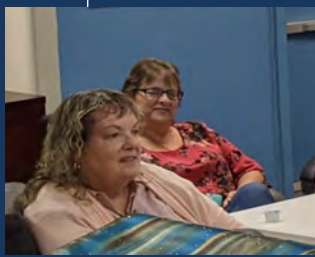
The board of directors is planning a Shabbat dinner in August and "Shabbat Under the Stars" in early September. They will be followed by the start of the High Holy Days.

COPS and CLERGY by Joan Zak

For the last several years, I have been attending a quarterly meeting with the Corona Police Department that they are now calling the "Cops and Clergy" meeting. My first meetings centered around work with a group called CityNet, which provides services for homeless people. Then, they showed us a police department helicopter and have discussed the various community programs in which the police are engaged. I encourage you to visit their Facebook page <https://www.facebook.com/CoronaPD/> to learn more about their community programs, either to participate, or, perhaps, bring back to your community.

Each quarter a different church, mosque or other religious institution hosts the meeting. The last meeting was held at the Police Department. Often the host will give a tour of the facility to anyone who is interested. I estimate about five people from the hosting location usually attend the meeting.

On Wednesday, August 11th at 8:00 in the morning (yawn!) we will be hosting the program here at CBS. Paula Fogel has graciously accepted an invitation to provide cookies, cake loaves and muffins for a continental breakfast and we will also serve bagels and lox (or we couldn't call ourselves Jewish!).

Representatives from many of the churches and the mosque in the Corona area will come to this meeting and all of our members are welcome to come as well. It's always interesting and I would welcome anyone to help me make the Corona Clergy people and the police folks who join us feel welcome and comfortable. There is NO COST to you or any attendee, but we need an RSVP so we know how much food to provide. Please contact Joan Zak at 760-803-5451 or by email at jzak@cox.net.

Recommended items for a Basic Emergency Supply Kit

Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:



- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps

Congregation Beth Shalom has a beautiful Simcha Board, called the *Tree of Life*, on display as you enter the synagogue lobby.

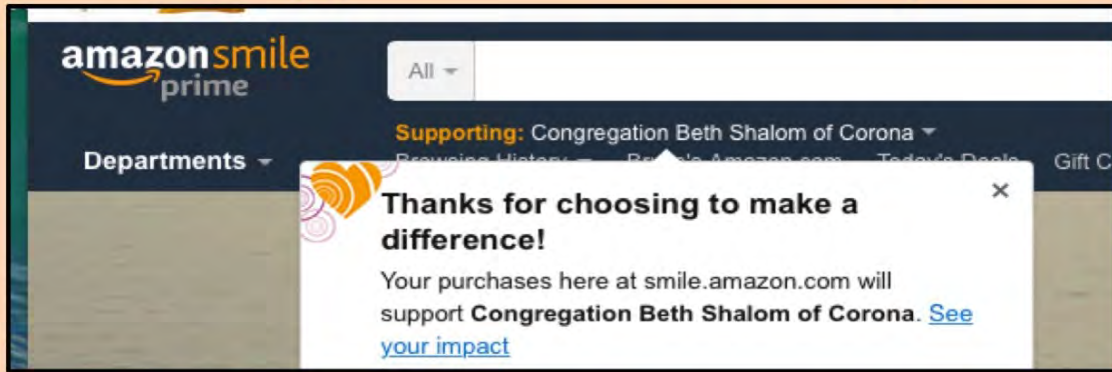

Food for Thought: A Recipe for Love

Love is in the air! At least if you live in Israel, you would be celebrating Tu B'Av, the Jewish holiday of love. Tu B'Av began during the Second Temple period as a celebration of *shiduchim*, or matchmaking. It was a time for young maidens dressed in white to dance in the vineyards during the grape

harvest and winemaking. This was the one day when all the tribes intermingled while young men would choose their bride. It just happens to be during the full moon, a symbol of love in ancient cultures. Today, the night is filled with dancing and singing in the moonlight. The women still

wear all white. Most likely, the ancient Jews feasted on the fruits of passion: figs, pomegranates, and dates. And the drink of choice, of course, is still wine.

Pomegranate Ice Cream by Renée Ryan-Tieszen

Ingredients

½ c. pomegranate seeds
2 Tbsp. sugar
3 Tbsp. powdered milk
½ c. whipping cream
2-3 drops red food coloring, optional

1. Purée pomegranate seeds in a blender. Strain pulp.
2. Add sugar and powdered milk to the strained pomegranate juice. Stir until dissolved.
3. Beat whipping cream until stiff peaks form.
4. Add pomegranate juice mixture. Softly fold until thoroughly blended. Add red food coloring.
5. Spoon mixture into metal loaf pan. Sprinkle top with pomegranate seeds. Tap pan on counter to release any air bubbles.
6. Cover with plastic wrap. Place in freezer for at least 8 hours or overnight before serving.

Directions

Tori Avey's Sangria by Renée Ryan-Tieszen

Ingredients

½ c. honey
½ c. water
1 pomegranate
1 apple, cored and sliced thinly
12 oz. seedless grapes
1 – 750ml bottle red wine (Syrah or Shiraz works well)
2 c. pure 100% pomegranate juice
1 c. grape juice
¼ c. brandy
¼ c. triple sec

1. Pour honey and water into a small saucepan. Heat over medium heat, stirring constantly until honey is completely dissolved into the water. Do not boil. Remove from heat and allow to cool. This is your honey simple syrup.
2. Meanwhile, seed the pomegranate. Discard the rind and pith. Place the pomegranate seeds onto the bottom of your pitcher.
3. Place the apple slices on top of the seeds and the grapes on top of the apple slices. Pour the entire bottle of red wine into the pitcher.
4. Add the pomegranate juice, grape juice, brandy, triple sec, and honey simple syrup to the wine. Gently stir with a long-handled spoon to blend all the flavors together.
5. Place the pitcher in the refrigerator to chill for at least 2 hours before serving to blend flavors. Stir again before serving. *Serves 8.*

NOTE: For a sparkly sangria, add 2 c. ginger ale to the mix prior to serving. Stir.

For a non-alcoholic mocktail version, substitute a bottle of red/purple grape juice for the wine and omit the brandy and triple sec.

Riverside Optimist presents scholarships

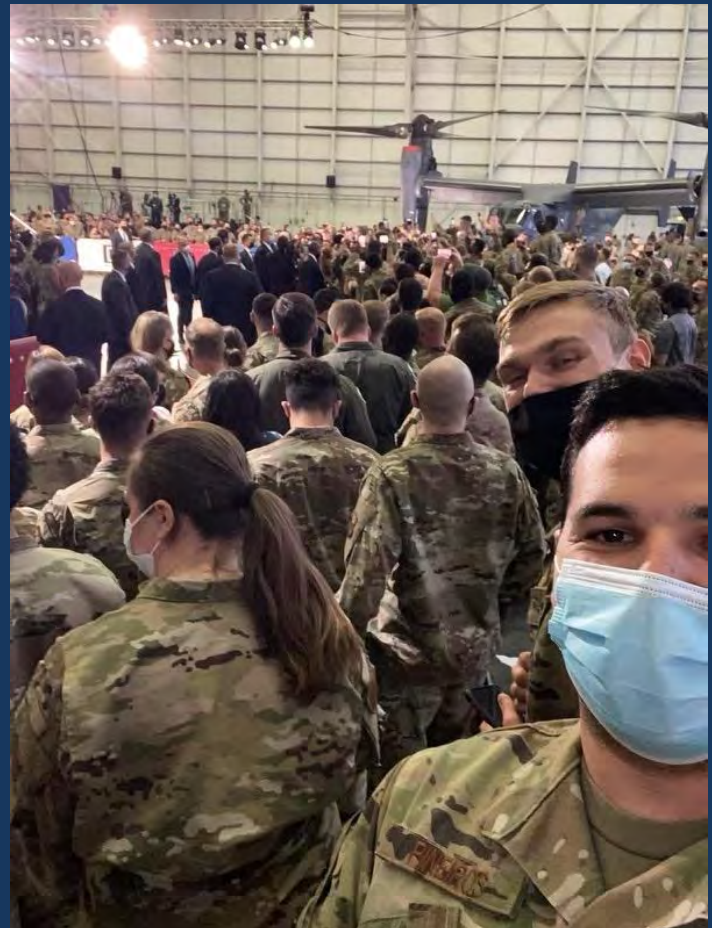

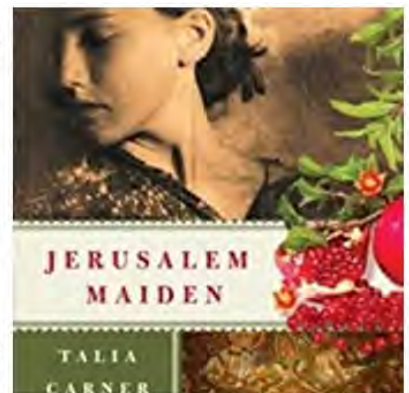
