## WORLD WIDE WRAP MAY 15

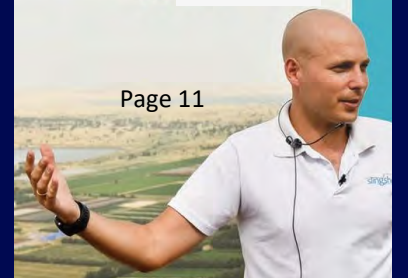

# President's Message

## THE CATSKILLS *A bygone history*

The Catskill Resort area is situated in the Borscht Belt, or Jewish Alps, in the Catskill Mountains in upstate New York. In its heyday, the area had as many as 500 resorts that catered to guests of different incomes and welcomed some 150,000 or so guests annually. It was mainly a popular vacation location for Jewish families from New York City.

The views from that lookout are fantastic and provide a beautiful sight of the colors of the fall season. Another option to explore the Catskills includes taking a train ride around the region. Those who love to snap the most spectacular shots of nature will enjoy this experience.

touted in railway advertisements of the era. This newfound interest in country wellness coincided with the decline of area farms in the early 1900s, leaving a great number of cheap, plum properties available.

At the same time, Jews were largely barred from many resorts and hotels in the northern Catskills and elsewhere. There are advertisements, newspaper articles, and correspondence about keeping Jewish families out. The fact is, they created this resort mecca in Sullivan County because they weren't welcome in a lot of places.

The area became known as the Borscht Belt, with resorts and bungalow colonies springing up across the region. The years 1940 to 1965 were considered the golden age of the Catskills, which peaked in the mid 1950s, says Conway. According to a New York Times article from May 10, 1953, there were 538 hotels, 1,000 boarding houses, and 50,000 bungalows in the Catskills.

Soon, the resorts catered to families by offering meals, entertainment, and activities in what were essentially all-inclusive resorts. Wives and children would spend weeks or months there each summer, with husbands joining on the weekends.

Boasting one of the most attractive settings in the Catskills, the historic Winter Clove Inn & Resort in Round Top is a mountain oasis just waiting to be explored. The delightful family-run 300-acre property is landscaped with well-manicured lawns and attractive gardens, all just steps away from a vast area of unspoiled wilderness, including spectacular nearby waterfalls.

These hotels became a haven for Jewish families looking to escape the hot city each summer. The Catskills, which span Ulster, Greene, Sullivan, and Delaware counties in New York, are typically 15 to 20 degrees cooler than New York City. Dotted with pristine lakes ideal for fishing and boating, the Catskills are also home to vast forested land ripe for hiking.

Tourism began in the middle of the 19th century, and not just because of the scenery. Many people — including doctors — believed the region was a healing environment, a quality

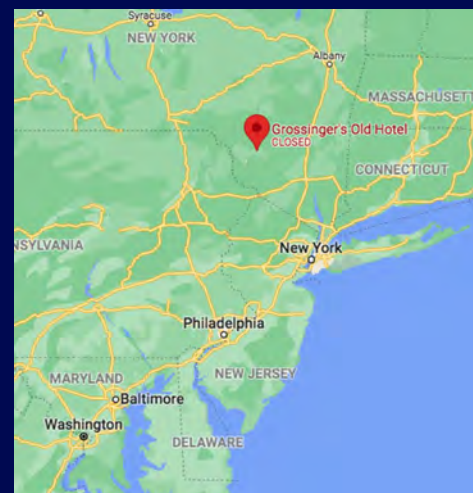
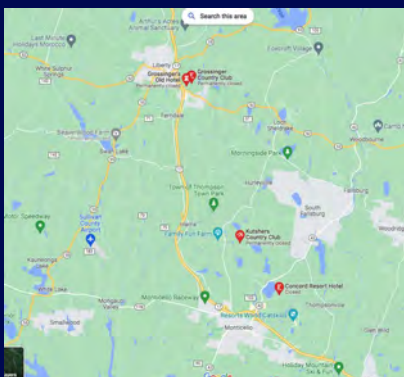
During your stay, you'll enjoy an **all-inclusive meal plan** (with three meals a day), heated outdoor and indoor **swimming pools**, and a beautiful **9-hole golf course** with mountain views. Other fun activities include an on-site antique bowling alley; a games room; as well as basketball, volleyball, and tennis courts. A nice perk is the inclusion of free cross-country ski gear when the snow falls.

A popular choice of accommodations, if available, is the resort's large three-bedroom suite set in the former carriage house. This nicely decorated unit comes with two bathrooms, a large living room area, and a mini-fridge.

All the hotels were run by families and most of them were named for the family that ran it. One particular hotel was known for being Orthodox, so all the big rabbis stayed at the Kantrowitz House because they had confidence in the family who was a well-known scholar. Most of the other hotels were run by Jews but were not observant — they were kosher but you could still check in on Shabbat.



Every hotel offered entertainment. The Kantrowitz House had a casino and they had traveling shows like Yiddish theater groups and groups that played music in the dining room. It was the Grossinger's Hotel which was the biggest resort, and then the Concord came later and was even bigger, and there was the Flagler, the Nevelee — those were all known for their entertainment. At the biggest Borscht Belt resorts attracted stars like Judy Garland, Sammy Davis Jr., Barbra Streisand, Lenny Bruce and Muhammed Ali, who trained at the Concord Hotel.



## Why It Declined

The decline of tourism in the Catskills began in the late 1960's. As air travel grew, the younger generation of Jewish-Americans looked further abroad for more exotic leisure destinations, sending the resort into decline and ruin. With the decline, the railways began cutting service to the area.

After the owner of Grossinger's died in 1972, the resort started to fall into decline. With guests choosing to fly elsewhere for the summer, the hotel closed it's doors for the last time in 1986. Since then it has been left to gradually fall into ruin.

Most properties that were abandoned for decades are finding buyers and in 2018, Resorts World Catskills casino and resort was built on the site of the Concord. Grossinger's was finally demolished at the end of 2018, with hopeful plans by the new owner for a new hotel. Kutsher's, which was the last of the major resorts to close in 2013, was demolished and a massive Ayurvedic wellness resort opened on the site in 2018.

Many of the hotels that have opened in the Catskills over the last few years, however, aren't large resorts at all, but instead are smaller boutique hotels which seems to fit the tastes of today's travelers better.

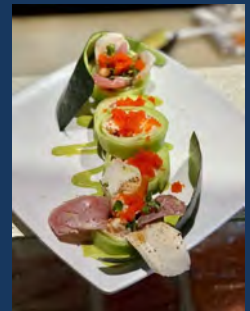
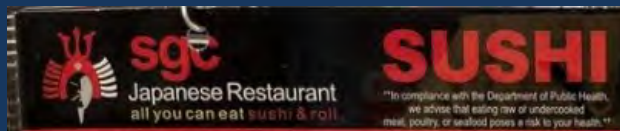

## Yellow Capped Coca-Cola!

If you've shopped for Coca-Cola recently, you may have noticed that some of the two-liter bottles had yellow caps instead of the usual red.

The switched-up lid shade is about more than aesthetics: **The yellow caps signify that the soda inside is kosher for Passover.**

Kosher, which means "fit, proper or correct" in Hebrew, describes food that adheres to dietary laws in Judaism, according to KLBD, one of the world's leading kosher certification agencies.

Jewish people who keep kosher must ensure that they eat only meat, poultry and dairy that have come from kosher animals, and which have been prepared in a kosher way.

There are some additional dietary rules during the spring holiday of Passover. During Passover, Jewish people do not consume leavened foods or fermented drinks derived from wheat, barley, oat, spelt or rye, according to KLBD. Some people also refrain from

eating a variety of legumes, including corn — and that's where Coca-Cola comes in.

Traditional Coca-Cola contains high-fructose corn syrup, which is made from corn. So, Coca-Cola created a special "kosher for Passover" version of their soda flavored with non-corn-based sweeteners, such as cane or beet sugar, to allow everyone to enjoy a Coke during the holiday, according to The New York Times.

Passover in a pandemic: Reflecting on family, food and traditions: "The Coca-Cola Company offers products as kosher year-round (KYR) and kosher for Passover (KFP)," Coca-Cola said in a statement to TODAY Food. "In the United States, both Coca-Cola and Diet Coke are available as KYR and KFP in locations where the bottlers have decided to seek certification. Kosher for Passover products can be found in select markets during the Jewish holiday of Passover (e.g. April 15—April 23, 2022).

"Only finished products bearing the logos of one of the designated Rabbinical organizations we work with can be guaranteed to be Kosher," the company continued, "as the production is supervised by these organizations through the entire end-to-end production process."

Some non-Jewish people also enjoy drinking "Passover Coke" because it's a throwback to how the drink used to taste when the company used cane or beet sugar, instead of corn syrup, as a sweetener.

This special, no-corn-syrup version is only available during Passover, which begins Friday April 15 and ends Saturday, April 23 this year — so, whatever your reason for grabbing a yellow-capped bottle of Coca-Cola, drink up while you can!

# Safety and Security Update by Joan Jacobs

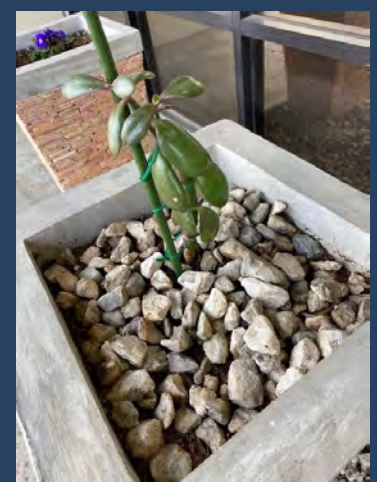
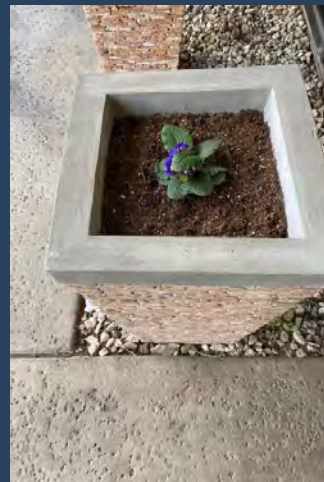
SAFETY is paramount for CBS' Board of Directors. Their goal is to ensure a place of worship and gathering that is safe from any challenges, interruptions and health concerns.

## Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps

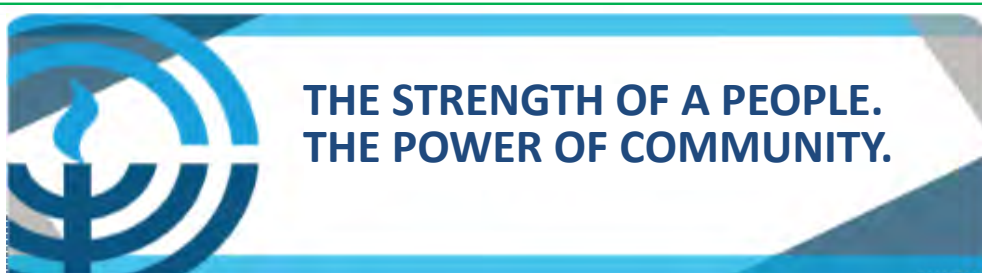

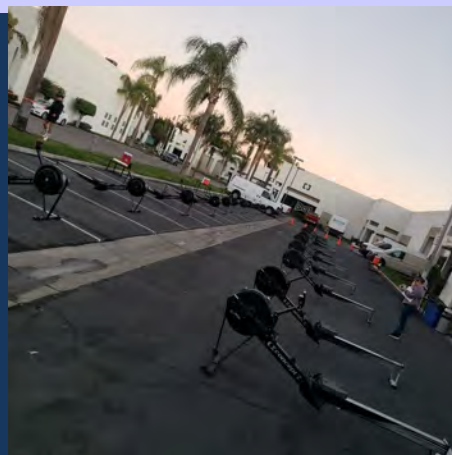
