# With our High Holy Days approaching, let us reflect and REMEMBER!

With Passover and **Shavuot** almost behind us (June 7), I look forward to the

summer months as we begin our preparation for the High Holidays at the end of September.

Before we get to those months, I wanted to take a moment to pause to relive some moments from the year so far in our community and my own personal family.

As my family continues to grow and grow up, I am reminded of the days when I went to Hebrew School with 20 of my cousins in Oswego, NY. We lived a Jewish year and Life Cycle as did Jews around the world have done throughout time, celebrating each holiday as they came, along with a change of seasons!

On the weeks that I am not in Corona, my small family congregates at our home for Shabbat. Traditions of lighting candles, singing Shalom Aleichem, blessing our children, Kiddush, washing our hands, and Motzi remind us of the week gone by and how blessed we are to have each other. When I am in Corona, we follow a similar pattern. Wherever you celebrate the holidays and Shabbat, traditions can be done at home and are real memory makers. It is very cute when I see my granddaughter who is not quite three years old yet, cover her eyes like her Mommy and Savta during the lighting of the Shabbat candles. During Kiddush, I hold her in my arms as we share the blessing of the wine, we wash our hands together with my special cup for water made at Yad LaKashish in Israel, followed by her Daddy saying Motzi.

Jewish denominations sometimes referred to as streams. movements or branches — are the principal categories of religious affiliation among American Jews. denominations are mainly distinguished from one another on the basis of their philosophical approaches to Jewish tradition, and their degree of fidelity to and interpretation of traditional Jewish law, or halacha.

Outside North America, the non-Orthodox streams of Judaism play a less significant role, and in Israel the vast majority of synagogues Jewish religious and institutions are Orthodox. even though most Israeli Jews do not represented a midpoint on the identify as Orthodox.

Even within North America, the role of the movements has diminished somewhat in recent years, with American growing numbers of and Jewish institutions Jews identifying Jewish," "just nondenominational transor denominational.

# **REFORM JUDAISM**

The largest affiliation of American Jews, some 35 percent of Jews,

Reform. emphasizes Jewish law. The movement has traditionally sought to adapt also Jewish tradition to sensibilities and sees itself as politically progressive and social -justice oriented emphasizing personal choice in rabbinic authorities over the matters of ritual observance.

# **CONSERVATIVE** JUDAISM

Known as Masorti (traditional) Judaism outside of North America, Conservative Judaism sees Jewish law as obligatory, though in practice there is an enormous range of observance among Conservative Jews. # ORTHODOX

Orthodox Jews are defined by their adherence to traditional understanding Jewish law as interpreted by centuries. Hallmarks Orthodox religious life include strict observance of Shabbat (no driving, working, turning electricity on handling money) and kosher laws. Though numerically the smallest of the big three — some 10 percent of American Jews identify as Orthodox-Orthodox Jews have larger than average families and their offspring are statistically more likely to remain observance observant Jews.

If its March, then it is Purim time. We were able to upgrade our Zoom puppet play show to а live the performance in






