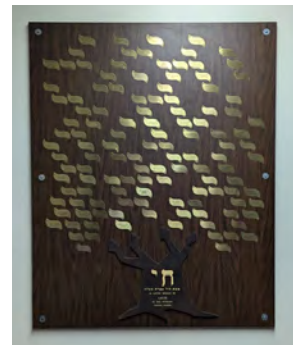
Tree of Life honors family members and friends

Once the Flags are in place, the solemn grounds will be watched over, and on the morning of Wednesday, September 11, they will begin reading the 2,977 names of those lives lost.

HELP ME HELP ANIMALS Xime's Bat Mitzvah Project

Hello, I am Xime and I am working on my Bat Mitzvah project! I've always liked animals ever since I can remember. In my eyes they can look so fuzzy, scaly, or even so ugly that they're cute. My family has owned four dogs in the past plus one hamster. One of our dogs actually came from the shelter. When we adopted him, he came with a blanket. Our current dog once cut her tail so badly that the vets used towels to clean all of the blood. Because of what happened, I went to Riverside Animal Shelter to find out how to help. They said that they desperately needed towels and blankets for the animals as they are used to either comfort the animals when getting adopted or cleaning up messes. I was inspired to collect donations of towels and blankets for my Bat Mitzvah Project.

Please help me help animals! Anyone can participate in my Project by donating towels and blankets so I can give them to the Riverside Animal Shelter. The blankets can be queen size or smaller. Towels can be 40"x 70" or smaller. Various sizes are needed because the Riverside Animal Shelter provides assistance for animals from horses to hamsters.

The donated towels and blankets can be placed in boxes, which will be located under the puppet show board at CBS. I will be collecting the towels and blankets through December 31, and accepting them personally at the Rosh Hashanah La'Behemot Service on Sunday, September 8 and at the Holiday Bazaar on Sunday, November 17. Thank you in advance to everyone who will be donating towels and blankets for my Bat Mitzvah Project. Watch the thermometer rise to reach my goal!
