
MEMORIALIZE YOUR DEAR ONES



SHATUF TZEDEK AWARD RECIPIENT -- DON KINDRED

Congregation Beth Shalom (CBS) is pleased to honor Don Kindred with the coveted Shatuf Tzedek Award (Business Partner Award). This recognition will take place on Sunday, March 23, 2025, as part of the synagogue's 18th Annual Legacy Luncheon. Additional honorees are Karen Alexander who will receive the Shomer Tzedek Award (Guardian of Righteousness Award) and Tanya Spiegel who will receive CBS' Legacy Award.

Don was born in Oakland, California and spent most of his young years in the San Francisco Bay Area. Although Don was very passionate about baseball and never missed a Little League season, he was also very involved in music. Don has played string bass since age 9 and was discovered to have an exceptional voice. He was encouraged to audition with the San Francisco Boys Chorus and found himself a new home among incredibly talented vocalists.

Being in the SFBC afforded him the opportunity to be a cast member with the San Francisco Opera Company where he performed in La Boheme, Tosca and Carmen. He also toured with the Vienna Boys Choir, sang the National Anthem at a Giants baseball game, and sang on the Ed Sullivan Show. Don does not sing anymore but continues to play string bass.

Don enlisted in the U.S. Navy and spent a good part of 1969 and 1970 in Vietnam. When asked today about his time in the Vietnam War, he will simply say "It was a character-building experience." Once Don received his Honorable Discharge from the Navy, he immediately enrolled in college and graduated from California State University Fullerton with a degree in Political Science in 1974.

Don spent 42 years in the retail and logistics industry with thirty-seven of those years working for Sears Roebuck and Company. Don's career spanned eight store manager assignments, two distribution centers and multiple district and regional positions.

Although Don retired in 2012, he founded the Corona Symphony Orchestra while still working in 2008. Five years later, the Corona Symphony Conservatory was created where they now teach string music education to children ages 6 to 18 with about 80 to 100 students per semester. Don will tell you "retirement is a misnomer." Other activities he is currently involved in are Board positions with Norco College President's Advisory Board, Christian Arts and Theatre and Circle City Kiwanis. Don is a member of Corona Norco Unified School District's Measure GG Oversight Committee, a member of U.N.I.T.Y, American Legion Post 742, Orange Grove High School "Jam Session" with more projects on the horizon.

Don is married to Shellie Kindred who is an educator at Corona High School. They are blessed with four children and five grandchildren.
