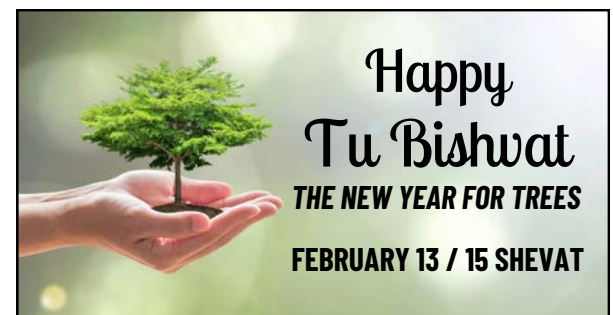
The percentages earned from physical gift cards, eGift cards, and digitally reloaded funds (onto existing physical gift cards) all go back to the synagogue.

CBS CREATES FUND TO SUPPORT THE PASADENA JEWISH TEMPLE AND CENTER

As you know, the fires in Pacific Palisades and Altadena have claimed many homes and businesses. One in particular was the Pasadena Jewish Temple and Center (PJTC) on the border of Pasadena and Altadena. The congregation's history dates back to the 1920's. It's one of the oldest in the Southern California area and serves the Greater San Gabriel Valley region.

When I read this story, the article talked about Cantor Ruth Berman Harris and her husband Laurance Harris running over to the shul. They grabbed all the Torahs and a few other items before they were forced to leave. The Torahs are now safe and at a congregant's home. However, the rest of the building and other structures were destroyed in the Eaton fire.

I made a connection with Laurance Harris about ten years ago when he was the Pacific Southwest Region representative for the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism (USCJ). He came to visit our synagogue several times, probably the most active of all the USCJ representatives we ever had. He was able to get us the third Torah we have now which is in the gold velour covering. We have been the custodian for that Torah for over ten years and have enjoyed the use of it in many services and occasions.

I contacted Laurance to offer my support wherever they might need it, for the shul or congregation.

Many of our CBS congregants have contributed to make a direct donation to their synagogue to help them get through this tragedy.

I would like to thank those who have already contributed to this outreach effort.

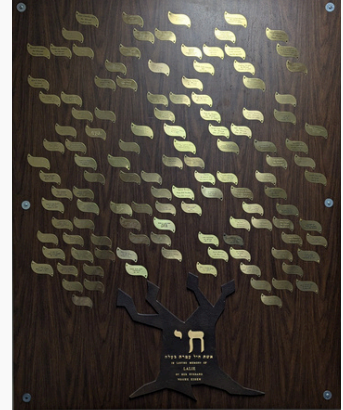

SHOMER TZEDEK AWARD RECIPIENT -- KAREN ALEXANDER

Congregation Beth Shalom (CBS) is pleased to honor Karen Alexander with the coveted Shomer Tzedek Award (Guardian of Righteousness Award). This recognition will take place on Sunday, March 23, 2025, as part of the synagogue's 18th Annual Legacy Luncheon. Additional honorees are Don Kindred who will receive the Shatuf Tzedek Award (Business Partner Award) and Tanya Spiegel who will receive CBS' Legacy Award.

Karen was born in West Germany while her father served in the US Army with the family moving to Corona after her father's discharge from the military. After high school, Karen graduated from Cypress College with a Computer Science associate's degree and later as Karen's children were in high school, Karen obtained a bachelor's degree from California State University Long Beach and a master's degree in public administration from California State University San Bernardino.

Karen and Tom Alexander have been married for 44 years and have three sons who are all in their late 30's to early 40's. Karen and Tom's children are happily married and have blessed them with six wonderful grandchildren, ranging in ages from 3 to 13 years old, each bringing them immense joy.

Karen retired from the Corona Police Department after 26 years and was lucky enough to work as a Dispatcher, Computer Services Technician, and lastly, retiring as a Crime and Intelligence Analyst with the Department. While working as the first-ever PD Analyst for Corona, she was recognized by Soroptimist International of Corona for "Outstanding Service / Women in Local Government" and received Corona PD's "Distinguished Service" Award.

After Karen and Tom's youngest son enlisted into the US Marine Corps in 2010, Karen joined and continues to volunteer with Blue Star Mothers. Additionally, Karen is part of "100 Women Who Care" who meet quarterly to raise funds for local non-profit organizations in the greater Corona - Riverside areas.

After Jim Steiner was elected to Corona's City Council in 2018, he appointed Karen as his Planning Commissioner, and she is currently serving her seventh year in that capacity. She also served for six years as a Board Trustee for the Northwest Mosquito & Vector Control District.

As a Corona resident for 42 years, Karen became concerned with the increasing number of people experiencing homelessness, impacting our residents and businesses, and volunteered with Karen Roper to bring solutions to the homeless concerns in the city.

The idea to start "Make It Cozy" (MIC) came about after individuals were being turned down for furniture donations. This "excess inventory" sparked an idea that these donated goods could not be wasted, and Karen solicited local businesses for storage space and was provided keys to a warehouse to create MIC during the pandemic. Unfortunately, this space was leased out and the site was lost. Over these last five years, Corona Homeless Solutions was able to secure a MIC partnership with First City Net as well as with the non-profit, Mercy House, to lease warehouse space and purchase a truck for MIC pick-ups from community donations. Today, MIC works with both City Net and Mercy House case managers and city advocates to supply furnishings and household / hygiene goods to supplement client move-ins.

In April 2022, Riverside County Supervisor Karen Spiegel recognized Karen as "District 2 Volunteer of the Year" for founding and managing the "Make It Cozy" program. Last year, Mercy House was able to hire Karen as a full-time community engagement specialist. Karen is dedicated to solving the homelessness issue in the Corona-Norco communities.
