The Crises of Our Time

The Call for Renewal

Plaques can be purchased through CBS; forms are available at the synagogue.

COPS & CLERGY PROGRAM

The Corona Police Department's Cops & Clergy Program brings together Police and Fire personnel with local faith-based leaders to strengthen communication, build trust, and address community issues. Meetings provide an opportunity for public safety officials to share program updates and for clergy to raise concerns and provide perspectives from their communities. Representatives from CBS regularly participate, sharing updates and staying connected with local public safety partners.

Blue Envelope Program

The Corona Police Department's Blue Envelope Program is designed to help individuals with autism, developmental disabilities, dementia, anxiety, hearing impairments, and other communication challenges interact more comfortably with law enforcement and emergency personnel.

Participants can keep important documents—such as identification, vehicle registration, insurance, and emergency contact information—inside a blue envelope that serves as a visual cue to officers that additional communication support may be needed. Participants may also choose to display program indicators on their vehicle or person.

Free program materials, including blue envelopes, stickers, seatbelt covers, keychains, bracelets, pins, and lanyards, are available at the Corona Police Department, 730 Public Safety Way. For more information, call 951-736-2330, Option 2.

The Guardian Program

The Corona Police Department has designed The Guardian Program as a proactive approach to continue providing excellence in policing to our community.

The Guardian Program allows members of our community to complete an assessment that is kept internally to assist officers in responding to calls for service that may include someone who has mental, physical, medical, or emotional injuries. These may include, but are not limited to Bipolar, Alzheimer, Autism, Wondering, Special Needs, Deaf-Blind, Non-Verbal Communication, and Triggers.

Dispatchers and Officers will have access to the assessment information that includes photographs, calming strategies/trigger avoidance, and possible destinations.

9/11-PATRIOT DAY

25th Anniversary Commemoration Ceremony

Over 100 years ago, Jewish National Fund-USA began restoring the natural landscape of Israel, replenishing the trees and vegetation that had been lost over time.



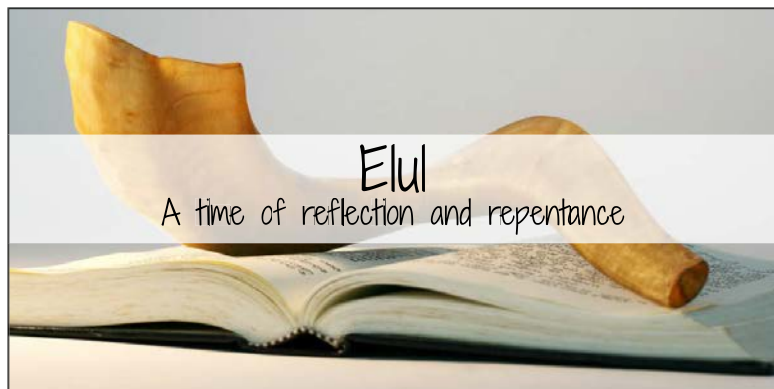
